THE NEXT FINANCIAL YEAR

The Parish Council has now agreed its draft estimates for the next financial year, starting 1st April 1998, which will be the final year of this Council's 4 year term of office. By increasing its income through agency agreements with B&NES Council, grants etc, the Council has been able to reduce its precept by nearly £2,000 whilst providing an improvement to the appearance of the village through increased pavement sweeping, footpath clearance, etc. The precept is collected as part of the B&NES Council Tax bills - the comparative figures published with this for parish council precepts show Saltford's precept to be lower than that for most villages and significantly lower than those of similar size.

In addition to the ongoing costs of pavement sweeping, footpath clearance, St Mary's Churchyard maintenance, grants and the salaries and other inevitable administration costs, specific provision has been made for setting up allotments (subject to B&NES Council offering satisfactory terms), a contribution to the library and towards the cost of a B&NES scheme for undergrounding the services from two BT telephone poles in the High Street to improve the appearance of the Conservation Area. Provision has also been made for "good ideas" during the year. Please contact me if you wish to see a copy of the Council's estimates.

What is not apparent from the estimates is the significant work of the Parish Council in terms of the planning process, the local viewpoint put forward on many of B&NES Council's policies (recent examples involved waste disposal and recycling and the cycling strategy). The Parish Council is able to highlight to B&NES Council local issues needing attention or improvement and suggest schemes which may be funded by either Council or both. It is looking forward to helping the work of the Saltford Millennium Celebrations Committee. A regular look at the monthly Council meeting agenda on the notice board outside the Post Office shows the range of matters dealt with which all have relevance to Saltford either today or in the future. Full Council meetings are held on the first Tuesday of each month at Saltford Hall (7.15pm), with the Planning and Environmental Committees meeting on the third Tuesday - all are welcome.

BOTTLE BANKS

The main bottle banks have now been replaced by smaller containers on the same site by the Library. This change was necessary because of difficulties in emptying the larger "domes" particularly now that the second pedestrian crossing is finally in place. B&NES Council has given an assurance that these containers will be emptied more frequently, but please let B&NES or me know if there are any problems. Glass can be left out on the doorstep in bags as part of the monthly recycling collection (2nd Monday of each month),.

FOOTPATH MAPS
