An Update on The Hall

Since the last SCAN we have continued to make improvements to the Hall and address maintenance items, so that the Hall is even more of a pleasure for people to use now and for future generations.

As mentioned in our last update, we have had significant water ingress issues in the below stage area for many years. I'm delighted to report that the work to seal the outside of the building is now complete. This was a far bigger job than we hoped and in total has cost us over £11,000 of our hard raised funds. Our thanks again to local residents Clive Shipley, who runs Arris Construction, and John Blake a local architect, for getting this work done. With the car park tarmac repaired, we will now be getting it relined and as part of this work will be incorporating additional disabled spaces by the front door and in the rear car park behind the tennis courts. The cost of relining will be met by a grant provided last year by Francine Haeberling.

The hearing loops have been installed in both the Main Hall and Avon Room. In both rooms we now have roving and tie clip microphones available, that will also work in conjunction with our PA systems. We would encourage all hirers of these rooms to make use of the hearing loop equipment to make their meeting more accessible to all – please mention to the Office when booking. In conjunction with the installation of the hearing loop in the Main Hall we have purchased a substantial new Sound Desk and by the time the Festival starts on 8 June we will also have installed a new PA system and speakers to go with this.

Also as part of our continual improvements at the Hall, we are also undertaking a comprehensive upgrade of the stage lighting system, to also include LEDs for the first time. These improvements will also be complete by the time the Festival starts, so those attending the many and varied fundraising events will be able to enjoy lighting and sound.

In terms of maintenance items we have replaced the old and inefficient hot water heaters in the stage area with modern low energy systems. We have also commissioned the replacement of all our leaking guttering at the rear of the building, plus a full replacement of fascias and guttering around the entire Wansdyke Room, together with significant work to repair the rotten gable ends of this building.

All the above work, combined with the huge effort to organise and run the Festival, has meant that for the moment we have not made further progress with the installation of a lift to allow better access to the upper rooms or the possibility of cladding the front exterior of the building to much improve insulation and appearance. We will seek substantial grants for both of these items. During the summer we will be looking at the refurbishment of the below stage area, now that is dry, for possible greater use in the future.

As always, none of this work is possible without the donations you provide, the money we make on fundraising events (particularly the Festival this year) and the income we derive from hiring out the Hall. In whichever way you may contribute, thank you so much for your support over the last few years which is now allowing us to tackle some of these long needed jobs.



SALTFORD

Saltford Station Campaign

The West of England Partnership made up of the four local authorities has formed a Local Transport Body. This is essential to receiving devolved major transport funding from Central Government. Metro West (Greater Bristol Metro) phases 1 and 2 are the top two priorities. The "new stations package" which includes Saltford has made it to a short list of approved schemes. Construction is suggested for the period 2018-2023 but may be brought forward if other funding opportunities arise.

There has been a delay in B&NES Council commissioning consultants to take the Station project to Network Rail's GRIP stage 2 of project development because of "uncertainties over the GWR franchise". This work is now going ahead. The consultation promised for Saltford will follow these studies probably later this year.

The B&NES Cabinet member for Transport is Cllr. Caroline Roberts who has replaced Cllr. Roger Symonds in this role. The Station Campaign Group is meeting with Cllr. Roberts.



SALTFORD FESTIVAL 8-16 JUNE 2013



West of England Rural Network

COULD THIS BE A GOOD TIME TO JOIN A COMMUNITY OIL BUYING SCHEME?

Householders and community buildings all over the West of England are paying less for their heating oil by joining a community oil buying scheme run by a local charity, the West of England Rural Network (WERN). The scheme works by placing a single collective order at the beginning of every month, and having greater negotiating power with heating oil suppliers.

Scheme co-ordinator Jill Baker says "Summer is a really good time to fill up your heating oil tank, as demand drops and prices tend to be lower. Suppliers are keen to work with us and give our members a really good price". Members of the scheme can order as little as 500 litres, and as infrequently as they choose, and still pay the negotiated price. The member oil price in May was 55.35p per litre (plus VAT at 5%). One of the scheme members recently saved £124 on a single 500L delivery, as they'd been paying 79p per litre on their top-up scheme. The annual membership fee is £20 for households, £30 for community buildings and £100 for businesses.

He told us about his early life in the close knit community of St. Phillip’s Marsh where he was brought up in a two up two down house with his parents and nine brothers. When the area was earmarked for slum clearance his family were moved to a four bedroomed house in Brislington. As children the local Sunday School had been very important and provided opportunities for such things as football. In later years members of various groups got together and memories from their days in “The Marsh” were gathered together and eventually turned into a musical which was first staged at Fry’s in Keynsham and then two sell out performances at the Bristol Hippodrome. Our May meeting was by Hannah Oakley from Banes Council titled “Love Food Hate Waste” talking about the amount of food wasted in this country. A third of food bought is thrown away, half of it still edible, which costs an average family £50 per month. There are three categories of waste :- avoidable which is caused by incorrect storage, unavoidable such as egg shells and potentially avoidable such as potato skins. The foods thrown away most frequently are bread and vegetables. The council has noticed a drop in the use of food waste bins but are not sure if this is because people are wasting less or that they have stopped recycling food. They are to carry out a three year survey to ascertain the reason. We should all remember that labels saying “Best Before” mean the food may have deteriorated

slightly but is still safe to eat. Anyone wanting recipe ideas for using left overs can visit www.lovefoodhatewaste.com.

New Mobile Youth Service for Saltford

For the next six months, Bath & North East Somerset Youth Service will be operating its mobile youth service in Saltford. Youth workers will be present on Tuesday evenings between 7pm and 9pm, with the 'bus' parked close to Saltford Hall. The plan is to engage with young people in the village and jointly develop a programme of activities as well as providing advice and services where needed. The initiative is supported by The Children's Society, Saltford Intergenerational Group, the Parish Council and the SCA. It is hoped that the work will contribute to the longer term provision of activities and events for young people in the village.

The Parish Council is giving a grant of £500 to Saltford Community Association to partially replace the stage lighting in the hall with modern low energy LED lights.
