Sybil Hall

It is with sadness that we report the death of our President, Mrs Sybil Hall. Sybil, who was nearly 90 years of age, died on the 25th April 1997 and was buried at St Mary's Church, Saltford, on the 2nd May 1997. She is survived by her sons Ted and Andrew and daughter Frances and their families.

The Hall family came to Saltford from Downend in the early 1950s and resided in Uplands Road. Husband, Harold and son Ted were early helpers in the building of Saltford Hall. Sybil became a member of the Saltford Community Association and served for a time on it's Management and Finance Committee as it's Secretary. She also worked tirelessly for the Ladies Committee of which she became Chairman. She later became a Life Member and Trustee of the Community Association and it's President in 1993.

Sybil was a regular and enthusiastic attender at Saltford Floral Club events since joining the club as one of it's first members. She was always most generous with her time and commitment serving the club as a Committee Member, Secretary and later it's President. She also, on the Floral Club's behalf, decorated the Christmas Tree in Saltford Hall each year until finally infirmity prevented her from doing so.

Sybil's cheery presence will be missed by all who know her and condolences are extended to her family.

SALTFORD LIBRARY

After a delay caused by staffing reorganisation in the B&NES Library service, initial discussions have been held with B&NES Librarians about the setting up of a local library committee for Saltford. The Parish Council felt such a group of local residents to be the most appropriate type of body to look at the best use of limited space and facilities at the Library and then to make recommendations to the B&NES Library service. Enquiries are being made into the set up of a similar group for Paulton Library to see how it works in practice. The Parish Council is prepared to give a one-off grant to Saltford Library, although the amount and use to which these funds are put will not be decided until more consideration has been given as to how this can give the greatest benefit to Saltford Residents.

St MARY'S CHURCHYARD

Many residents will not realise that the Parish Council is responsible for the maintenance of the closed churchyard at St Mary's Church. As well as grass cutting, hedge trimming etc., this involves keeping the walls in a safe condition. In the light of a detailed survey of the walls' condition, repair work has been carried out recently to two sections of wall next to public footpaths. A grant application has been prepared to help towards the cost of this and the further work which is needed over the next few years to keep the walls in stable condition.

BUS SHELTERS

Administrative delays in drawing up a transfer agreement with B&NES Council have meant that the Parish Council does not yet own the four bus shelters along Bath Road (excluding the shelter outside

the Post Office which is subject to a separate agreement). However, the Parish Council will be cleaning these every month from now on - all bus users should have noticed a substantial improvement after their first clean a few weeks ago. Once the shelters have been transferred to the Parish Council, they will be painted each year to keep them in good condition.,

FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE

Grants have recently been given to two organisations who give advice to Saltford - to Cruse, which gives bereavement counselling, and to Community Action which advises parish councils, village halls etc., on all aspects of services in rural areas, and has been a valuable source of grant aid for the Parish Council in the past.

DOG FOULING

Once again, complaints have been made about the amount of dog fouling taking place, particularly on the footpaths off both sides of the High Street. The Parish Council is consulting B&NES Council as to whether any further action is possible, but wishes to stress to dog owners the importance of clearing up after dogs on public footpath surfaces even if they appear to be in a semi-rural area.

CYCLING ON PAVEMENTS

The Parish Council has also been asked to highlight the dangers of (illegal) cycling on pavements which are not designated as cycleways. It is understood that a number of collisions/near misses have happened between cyclists and car drivers coming out of their driveways, particularly on the A4 between Norman Road and Lansdown Road.
