

### SALTFORD ENVIRONMENT GROUP

The RSPB's annual Big Garden Birdwatch will be held over the weekend of 28-30 January. Over one million people took part last year, so if you join in you'll be in great company by contributing to this annual survey that helps give an indication of the health of our wild birds.

Taking part is easy and this is a great chance to sit back, relax and watch birds and other wildlife for an hour - and to encourage younger members of your family to develop an interest in the local wildlife. By taking part, you'll find out all about the fascinating wildlife that flutters, crawls and hops in your garden, balcony or local area. And with a simple hour of mindful watching, you could have an hour to yourself, too.

Full details including resources and ideas including tips on making your garden an attractive place for birds to stop for a snack can be found

If you and/or your family are enthused about wildlife check out SEG's website news page for details of Saltford Parish Council's "All you seed is love" Saltford wildflower project backed by SEG and our B&NES Ward Councillors. The aim of this SPC project is to support pollinating insects by creating new - or enhancing existing - wildlife habitats throughout the village. These can be at the end of residential roads, in small open spaces, roadside verges, by the river - in fact anywhere that B&NES Council (the landowner) agrees. It is also a great opportunity to brighten up the village and get Saltford blooming!

Professor John Newton, Director of health improvement at Public Health England, insists the activity is 'just what the doctor ordered' and a great way to kickstart the post-Covid health recovery.

## SALTORD BRASS MILL

After a long period of closure due to the pandemic we opened the weekends September 11/12 and 18/19 for Museums Week. During September and October we were open to the public for 9 days and had a total of 360 visitors including 75 children and several dogs. (We are a dog friendly venue.) The vast majority of visitors were local from the Bath Bristol and Somerset areas, but we also had people from Durham, Oxford and even Boston, USA. This was a lady who grew up in Saltford and remembered the mill being dilapidated and practically roofless. She was surprised and delighted to see it restored and open to the public.



Notable also were a part of the Ollis family from Portishead, doing research into their ancestry. They had only recently re-discovered their connection to the mill. Skilled workers of this name, among others, came over from Northern Europe in the early 1700s to help develop the brass industry here.

On November 24th we were pleased to welcome our Metro Mayor Dan Norris, along with councillors Alistair Singleton and Duncan Hounsell to visit Saltford Brassmill.

The mill will be closed for the winter months and displays safely packed away from the risk of floods. However volunteers will continue maintenance work and preparations for re-opening in May 2022. We are always in need of volunteers to help with practical tasks in the garden and mill as well as welcoming our visitors and talking with them during their visit.

## **AVON WILDLIFE TRUST**

Keynsham Group, Avon Wildlife Trust's program of online talks enjoyed good audiences in the Autumn and we hope to continue with this trend in January and February. Our talk on Friday 14th January features "The Glimmering World of Glow-worms" with Pete Cooper who will tell us about his breeding program of these illuminating insects. Pete, an ecologist, works with the Derek Gow Consultancy which specialises in rewilding and the reintroduction of species.

On Friday 11th February we are excited to host "The Poole Harbour Osprey Project" with Liv Cooper, project manager from charity The Birds of Poole Harbour. This project which started in 2017, involves the translocation of 60 juvenile Ospreys from Scottish nests into the Poole Harbour area. The process aims to create a bond between the young Ospreys and their new local area, before they leave on their first treacherous migration, usually to West Africa and draws the Ospreys back to Poole Harbour on their return to the UK as

mature birds, when they will identify suitable nesting sites. The translocation therefore lays the foundations for their return as a breeding bird to the South Coast, 180 years on from their local extinction. During 2021 a partnership of male and female was formed and there are high hopes for 2022! Find out more at our Zoom talk.

## PAVING THE WAY IN SALT福德



B&NES has very good knowledge of the condition of all the road surfaces in the local authority area based on annual surveys. This is not so with pavements (asphalt concrete footways) with a huge gap in knowledge. A hoped for grant from the Department for Transport to survey pavements has not been released yet. Only a small sum is set aside in the B&NES budget for capital improvement works relating to pavements across the whole of B&NES. We have been lobbying for pavement improvements in Saltford since being elected. This has born fruit. We categorised as high priority those pavements that form arterial routes around Saltford with high numbers of pedestrians using those pavements. We are pleased to report that some sections of pavement in Saltford have been re-laid. The heavily used pavements close to the top entrance to Saltford School in Manor Road and a particularly bad short section in Montague Road have been re-laid. The poor state of pavements is a national problem that requires massive UK government investment to tackle properly. We will continue to press for more pavement improvements in the ward as funds become available. Pavements are built for pedestrians and not cars and vans. It is important that residents with mobility issues, mobility scooters, or prams and buggies do not have pavements blocked off by vehicles and forced into road traffic.



# Saltford Community Cinema






