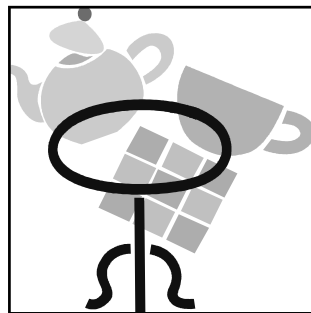

From the local police.....

Incidents of Anti Social Behaviour appear to be on the increase again. Residents in Claverton Road have been subjected to nuisance behaviour by groups of youngsters over the last couple of weeks. Officers have attended and spoken to these individuals, taken their details and dealt with them in the appropriate manner. Patrols in the area have been increased and Special Constables will be assisting over the next few days.

P.C Harris reports that these nuisance youths appear to be mainly from the Saltford area itself. Residents are encouraged to speak to the parents of the offending youths if they are known. This will help to create a more cohesive and inclusive community.

Contacting the Police

P.C Harris also advised that if youths, or anyone else, are seen causing criminal damage, they should telephone 999 and advise that this is in progress. Nuisance behaviour that is ongoing, but where damage is not being caused, or a historic report of criminal damage, should be reported via the **Avon and Somerset Force Service Centre on 0845 456 700**. This number can be used 7 days a week 24 hours a day.

Your PCSO Sarah Hewlett will also be on foot patrol in the area and may be approached to make any reports or enquiries.

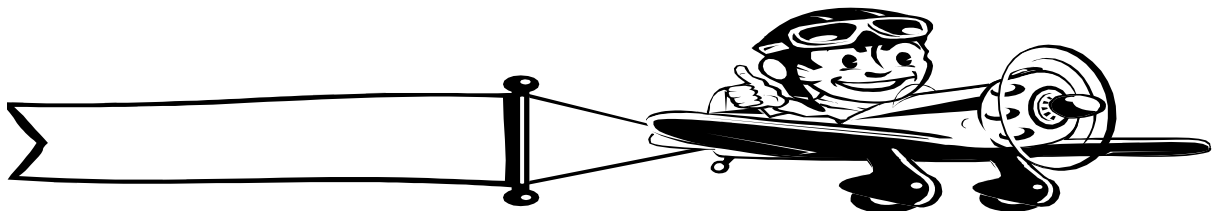
Bus fares

We have established that the adult return fare after 9am from Saltford to Bristol is £5.90 and Saltford to Bath is £5.60. In some cases, people have been charged more. We have had no response from First Bus to our complaints that the fares from Saltford are unfair in comparison to the Bristol-Bath fares.

Bristol Airport planning application

Bristol Airport has applied to North Somerset Council for expansion to 10 million passengers per annum, from a current figure of 6.2 million. However, the proposals in the planning application would allow the numbers to grow beyond this as the airport is seeking to avoid any capping on passenger numbers or air transport movements. The Parish Council will consider this at its Planning Committee meeting on 21 July (7.15pm at Saltford Hall – public welcome) or you can comment direct to North Somerset Council – see www.n-somerset.gov.uk. The consultation period runs until 7 August.

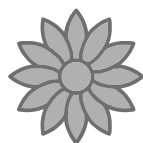
