As SCA is now over 40 years old, we consider it the right time to publish a history of the organisation. We hope to have the first instalment published in the next edition of SCAN.

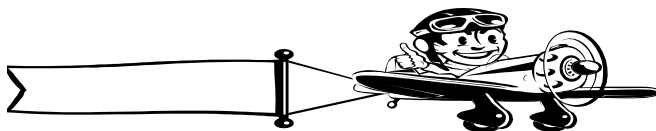
Whilst thinking of the valuable premises and various activities undertaken, would members consider setting up bequests so that this work and the fabric of the facility may be made available to future users.

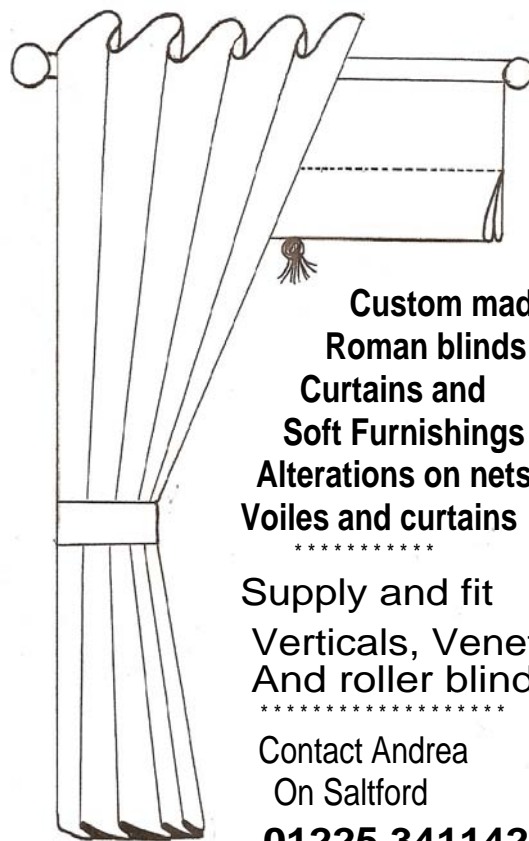
