It was with great regret that the SCA received the resignation of Mrs Pat Martin on 2 May 1996. Pat had served as our Honorary Booking Officer for 18 years and as the Honorary Membership Secretary for three years prior to that. You will note that the word Honorary is stressed because during her 21 years' service as an officer of the SCA Pat received not one penny in salary or in any other form of payment. Despite this, her dedication to the SCA was second to none and the hours spent on the telephone, in receiving and acknowledging bookings, in sending accounts and the receipt and banking of many thousands of pounds over the years, are incalculable.

It is often said that Saltford Hall must be one of the busiest in the area, if not the country, yet Pat still coped with the demands on her time despite being a busy housewife, mother and grandmother.

George, her late husband, despite his seeming grumbles at having his meals and rest disturbed by the endless telephone calls and visitors was always supportive and his role should also be acknowledged.

Pat occasionally had to ask questions of colleagues in particularly difficult situations, but invariably because of her vast experience and commonsense had the answer before they had.

She did not suffer fools gladly, but at least you knew where you stood with her and undoubtedly when placed in a position of conflicting demands she would go to great lengths to be helpful, juggling the bookings to ensure that the users of the Hall were accommodated as well as ensuring maximum income for the SCA. Pat was, until recently, a member of Saltford Singers and was their Publicity Officer for many years amongst other positions. She is also a member of Saltford Drama Club and was their Wardrobe Mistress on a number of productions. Even there she was, no doubt because of her own dedication, always reminding her colleagues of the benefits that membership of the SCA brought them -

A4 TRAFFIC CALMING

Residents have expressed their concern at some of the traffic calming measures being carried out along the A4 through Saltford.

The need for action to reduce the speed of traffic through Saltford was raised a year ago, and proposals discussed and agreed with the Highways Agency (Department of Transport), Avon County Council and Saltford Parish Council. Since then it appears that details of the scheme have been changed and additions made, of which the Parish Council was not made aware.

In addition, after the abolition of Avon County Council at the end of March, the contract for carrying out the scheme is now between the Highways Agency (based in Dorking, who are responsible for the A4 as a trunk road) and a private firm of transport consultants who monitor the work on the ground in accordance with the contract. As a result, it appears that there is no public body locally to which complaints/changes can be referred. The Parish Council is awaiting a reply from the Highways Agency for more information on the work being carried out and the possible timetable for essential parts of the original scheme, particularly a second pedestrian crossing in the village centre and a speed camera.

Frustratingly for local residents, it appears that much of this scheme has been carried out without due regard to local considerations and opinions.

The Parish Council is hopeful, however, that the main stated aim of reducing traffic speeds and improving safety for pedestrians will be achieved through these

measures.

HANGING BASKETS

The Parish Council hopes to brighten up the village shopping area this Summer by providing 12 hanging baskets above the shops. Subject to a verbal maintenance agreement being confirmed, these should be in place soon. Look out also next Spring for some extra flowering bulbs around the village.
