SALTFORD BRASS MILL

With the Mill CLOSED and the displays and models which form the Education and Interpretation Centre inside the Mill moved to higher levels, the deluge



duly arrived at New Year! Parts of the Mill were waist-deep, equalling known records. Volunteers have worked to clear away the silt and clean the walls and the huge balance beams which floated around the old squash court. Everything will be back in place for our opening for National Mills Weekend – 11th and 12th May. Sadly, the exterior walls and chimney are showing signs of decline and we hope a recent meeting between B&NES and Historic England will have identified a way forward.

We rely on our volunteers, who continue their work to care for the Mill all year as well as welcoming visitors on open days and for group visits. We are always looking for NEW MEMBERS to help. There is a wide variety of roles and opportunities. We meet every second and fourth Saturday mornings. We have been absolutely delighted to welcome three or four new volunteers over the winter and we hope they enjoy finding their niche. Please help if you can.

Since the Mill was acquired by the Bristol Brass company in the 1720s and converted it to process brass. Three hundred years on, Saltford Mill is nationally, even internationally, recognised. As a unique remnant of a special time, it is a Scheduled Ancient Monument and a Grade2* Listed Building: a captivating place with a fascinating story which we aim to tell – allowing visitors of all ages to learn about a critical period in local social and industrial heritage which developed here in the Avon Valley even before the age of steam.

KEYNSHAM GROUP. AVON WILDLIFE TRUST

Two more talks finalise our program for the season.

Friday March 8th - "Wild Hidden Bulgaria" with wildlife photographer Victoria Hillman. Bulgaria has a rich variety of habitats including lowlands, plains, hills, mountains, valleys and gorges. Its geographical position, the different habitats and low intensity farming methods result in one of the richest bio-diverse areas in Europe. Victoria, whose passion for the natural world began at a very early age, will take us through some of this amazing wildlife with her own very special style of photography.

On Friday April 12th we welcome Hamish Smith, from the Bath Peregrine Project, for his view on "How Peregrines Exploit the Modern Landscape". Hamish is Involved in several peregrine projects with the BTO, Hawk & Owl Trust and Hawk Conservancy, and he will examine the differences and similarities of peregrine behaviour in different environments and consider interpretation of data from dispersing fledgling juveniles. With a healthy urban population of peregrines in both Bristol and Bath, he has much data to draw on for his talk.

Our talks are held each month at the Baptist Church Hall, Keynsham BS31 1DS at 7:30pm and entry costs £3.50 for Avon Wildlife Trust members/£4.50 for non-members to include refreshments served at 7:15pm before each talk. All welcome, no booking required.

Access Sport Development Manager Jonny Fenner. Access Sport is a national charity and they kindly provided training for all the volunteers involved in the event. Seven enthusiastic young people took part in adapted games and creative drills using specialist



equipment enabling them to learn new skills and enjoy tennis. Helen Abbott from Avon tennis also attended. SALTFORD ENVIRONMENT GROUP

1,300, 800 or 500 new houses and a new school in Saltford's Green Belt?!

One of those outcomes is likely to occur if, after

the consultation on development options, B&NES Council puts forward Saltford for new housing development in the new draft Local Plan (2022-2042), and these end up in the approved plan. The options under consideration are Saltford West (500 houses) adjacent to Grange Road and South Saltford (800 houses) adjacent to Montague Road, Manor Road. A new primary school would accompany either or both options.

The protection of Saltford's Green Belt from inappropriate development is one of SEG's key objectives. Saltford will risk losing its rural village status and be consumed within a continuous urban sprawl from Bristol. Local roads would be heavily congested even more during peak travel times, local wildlife will lose habitat.

The local open countryside is important for our health and well-being. We want to protect the Green Belt not just for ourselves and for wildlife, but for those who live in local towns and cities and appreciate being able to get out of town and into open countryside relatively quickly.

The most effective way you can help prevent the loss of our local countryside is to give B&NES Council your response through the consultation process itself. Objections from residents need to be based on planning reasons; emotional or subjective responses will be considered invalid

When this edition of SCAN is published the options consultation by B&NES Council, scheduled for 12th February to 8th April, should be underway. Please visit our website www.saltfordenvironmentgroup.org.uk for specific guidance on how to respond effectively to the consultation and then re-visit regularly for updates on the Local Plan process.

SALTFORD4NATURE

Freezing January temperatures and flooding temporarily halted planting on the beds in front of Saltford House. Every cloud has a silver lining however, and this has given Saltford4Nature volunteers time to focus on propagating seeds at home, with a view to donating them to a colourful display of pollinator-friendly flowers for the summer.

In an article in February's edition of Gardeners' World Magazine, (p 35), Monty Don highlights

the loss of habitat for many species and the need to support our pollinators, as they are crucial to our own food production and, therefore, survival. "It is not too late", he encourages, "Something we can all do is make our gardens, however small, a haven for wildlife of every kind." One of the best ways



we can do this is by planting flowers that bloom in succession, providing nectar throughout as many months as possible. It is best to have simple, saucer-shaped flowers, allowing easy access for pollinators. With that in mind, we are aiming to grow from seed, flowers such as Cosmos, which bloom from June until November, providing late pollen and, hopefully, an attractive splash of

colour in front of Saltford House.

Our efforts in the left-hand bed appear to have been successful; the plants (a scheme of purple, pink, white and blue flowers) are beginning to show the green shoots of new growth beneath their dried winter stalks. Encouraged, we will shortly start planting in the right-hand bed with a view to both borders being in flower come early summer. In the meantime, we can all enjoy Saltford House's lovely annual display of daffodils across the back of the borders offering us the promise of spring around the corner. OTHER NEWS

Have your say -The Local Plan, 1300 houses, and Our Green Belt

A Local Plan sets out how development will be planned for. The next B&NES Council Local Plan will be adopted in 2025 and take us up to 2042. Standard calculations show that there needs to be 6000+ new dwellings bult in this period over and above what already has planning permission. As part of the legal process in preparing a plan, the B&NES planning department has listed a menu of "options" for consideration of where housing could go. Two sites have been listed at Saltford – Saltford South (800 houses and a new school) and Saltford West (500 houses and a new school).

A public consultation runs from 12th February up to 25th March. It is vital that everyone takes part in this consultation, the most important for many years.

1300 new residences identified for Saltford's green belt: B&NES Council Local Plan 'Options Consultation' – please respond!

At the time of going to print, B&NES Council's Local Plan 'Options Consultation' is due to open on 12 February and end on 8 April (residents are advised to check the B&NES website). SPC appreciates that the 'options' presented for up to 1300 new residences in Saltford, on green belt, will be of interest - and possible concern - to many residents.

Now is the time to let B&NES Council know your views about the proposals. Cllr Jon Godfrey, SPC Chair, spoke on behalf of SPC at the Public Meeting held by Saltford's B&NES Ward Councillors on 26 January (see image). Cllr Godfrey's key message was the need for residents to respond directly to the B&NES consultation, and not to rely on neighbours or other organisations to do so on their behalf.

Saltford's Annual Parish Meeting (APM) will take place on Friday 1 March starting at 7pm at Saltford Hall, as hosted by SPC. Residents are welcome to attend, details are on SPC's 'Meetings – Agendas and Minutes' webpage and noticeboard. The 'Big Thank You' event will be co-hosted with Saltford Community Association following the APM

SPC sets its precept for 2024/25

Saltford Parish Council consistently levies one of the lowest precepts in the B&NES Council area and this position is likely to remain the same after an increase in precept for 2024/25. An average Band D property (Band D is used as the national comparison) in Saltford will pay £30.69 p.a. This is a £3.61 per year increase for an average Band D property, or an increase of c.30p per calendar month. Although SPC has agreed an increase of its precept of 13.7%, as the Tax Base for Saltford has increased for 2024/25, this will translate on the Council Tax letter as an increase of 13.3%.

As part of its budget setting process, SPC agreed to create a 'Miscellaneous Grants – Environment' budget of £500 for 2024/25. Local organisations that meet eligibility criteria can apply for grant funding to support environmental initiatives of benefit to Saltford and its community. We all know that words change their meanings over time or take on new ones.

One word that has become almost the casualty of the 21st century is the word 'truth'.

People glibly speak of 'my truth' when they mean simply 'my opinion'.

Many politicians seem to think that truth is 'what I just said', and this can change to suit their purposes.

So, what is truth? The same question has been asked many times, hasn't it?

Philosophers have had masses to say about it, but most of us ordinary mortals are happy to say that truth can be expressed in simple statements of *fact*.

The problem with that is that facts can change as a result of new discoveries and experiences. (Scientists have been telling us that for ages.) So, if facts can change, does truth too?

The word *truth* is used a lot in religious circles, including Christian ones (even by those with rather weird, way-out and warped views!). Jesus, we read in the Bible, used the word a lot, which raises an interesting point. The word translated 'truth' there, is a Greek word which means literally, "without being in a dreamlike, drugged stupor." In the light of this, 'true' is the opposite of 'imaginary', and 'truth' is 'reality'. It's about how we *experience* things, not about whether a fact or opinion is right or wrong.

Reading the Bible with this in mind avoids misunderstandings about which 'facts' are 'true'. It helps us to see that our faith (another often mis-used word) is 'true', not because of a set of facts, ideas or beliefs, but because we *experience* it as real. We are in a relationship with God.

Jesus said, "I am the **way** the **truth** and the **life**". I am the **real (true) way** to live **life**. He lived life in conscious relationship with God. That is the Christian message...we *all* can live that life.
