Permissive Paths – Donation Appeal

The Permissive footpaths south and west of Saltford, which had been closed at the end of 2013 following the withdrawal of subsidy for public access by DEFRA, were re-opened to the public at the end of 2014 thanks to a generous donation of £3000 from Eveleighs Estate Agents. We hope most of you have enjoyed walking, running and riding on these paths at some point over the last year.

During that last year Saltford Community Association have been trying to raise £3,000 to keep the permissive footpaths around the village open for another year and including a donation from the Day Lewis Pharmacy in Saltford, have hit the target. This means that the paths will now remain open till the end of October 2016.

We are now launching our appeal to keep the 4.5km of permissive pathways open for the following year and once again need your support to raise £3000. Remember if we can't raise this amount, the paths will shut probably for ever! See page 23 for a map of the permissive paths.

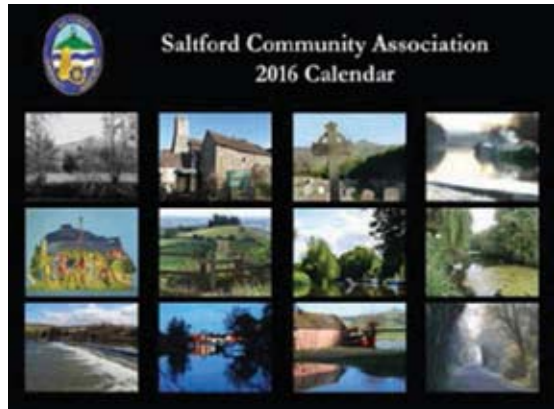

Michael Rehfisch – Holocaust Survivor

On 18 September 2015 Saltford lost a very unique resident of over 30 years. During the 2013 Festival we showed a filmed interview with Michael about his remarkable life which many of you attended and others would have known him through his membership of the Scrabble Club. We had also asked Michael to open the 2015 Festival, but unfortunately he wasn't well enough.

At his funeral on 28 September, his grandson Tom Bright read out a summary of his remarkable life, which with his permission we thought many of you would be interested to read below.

Michael was a German Jew born in Dresden at a time when children were children. His father was an insurance broker and his mother was a housewife.



When Michael was 11, things changed almost overnight when Jewish communities were openly persecuted across Germany and Austria, causing his family to flee to Prague. Having to start again, and with the additional challenges of a language barrier, it was a difficult time but Michael's family did what they could. Sadly, 2 years later, Michael's father died leaving just Michael and his mother.

Then in 1941 the war had spread and Michael and his mother were forced to move to a ghetto outside Prague. It was during this time that Michael's mother tried to arrange for him to join a kinder-transport group being given sanctuary in Britain. However Michael's escape from the ghetto was blighted when Britain declared war on Germany.

In 1944 Michael was separated from his mother and sent to Auschwitz, where he had his head shaved, was tattooed with a number that would serve as a permanent visual reminder and put to work as a labourer. 3 weeks later he learnt his mother had died in the gas chambers.

These were undoubtedly gruelling long days, with little sleep, food or hope. One particular memory that Michael recalled was when he fell asleep leaning against the wheel of a wagon, and was awoken by the butt of a guard's rifle striking his head. It left him badly wounded. He was picked up and marched out and Michael thought his time had come. However the guards were marching him to a hospital wing, where a Jewish doctor treated him for three days. Despite still being injured the doctor told Michael that they were due a site inspection, and however bad he felt he needed go back to work – because if he seemed ill, then his fate would be sealed, so Michael returned to work.

As the war neared the end, remarkably Michael said there was never a feeling of despair, instead there was a hint of optimism, that the Russians were on their way and finally they began to close in.

Michael was then taken on one of the infamous Nazi death marches as they retreated deeper into Germany. During one of these marches Michael and 2 others couldn't keep up with the pace and, in all the panic, the guards didn't keep track of stragglers, so they began their escape. Whilst trying to find food, three SS guards pulled up on motorbikes with sidecars and opened fire. Michael leapt to cover and managed to escape the bullets. Michael then hid for several days and eventually he heard the sound of advancing tanks, and to his relief it was finally, the Russians.

Although Michael had no family, possessions or anywhere to call home, he now had his freedom. Michael was then placed in a displacement camp and for the first time started to dream about beginning a new life, potentially in the USA.

One can only imagine the sheer level of uncertainty and confusion as the Germans retreated and allies arrived, and it must have seemed like a sheer miracle when one day, a British Jewish soldier approached Michael claiming to be his cousin, and that he had been sent by Michael's grandfather in Tel Aviv to find him. After a further journey by land and sea, Michael was smuggled into Palestine to join his grandfather and start a new life.

Michael would live in Israel for 40 years where he settled into family life, meeting his first wife Malvina, and having his son Amir and daughter Irit and taking up work as coach driver. War was never far away though and in times of conflict Michael was a 1st Sergeant in the Air Force, being involved in 4 major conflicts in the region.

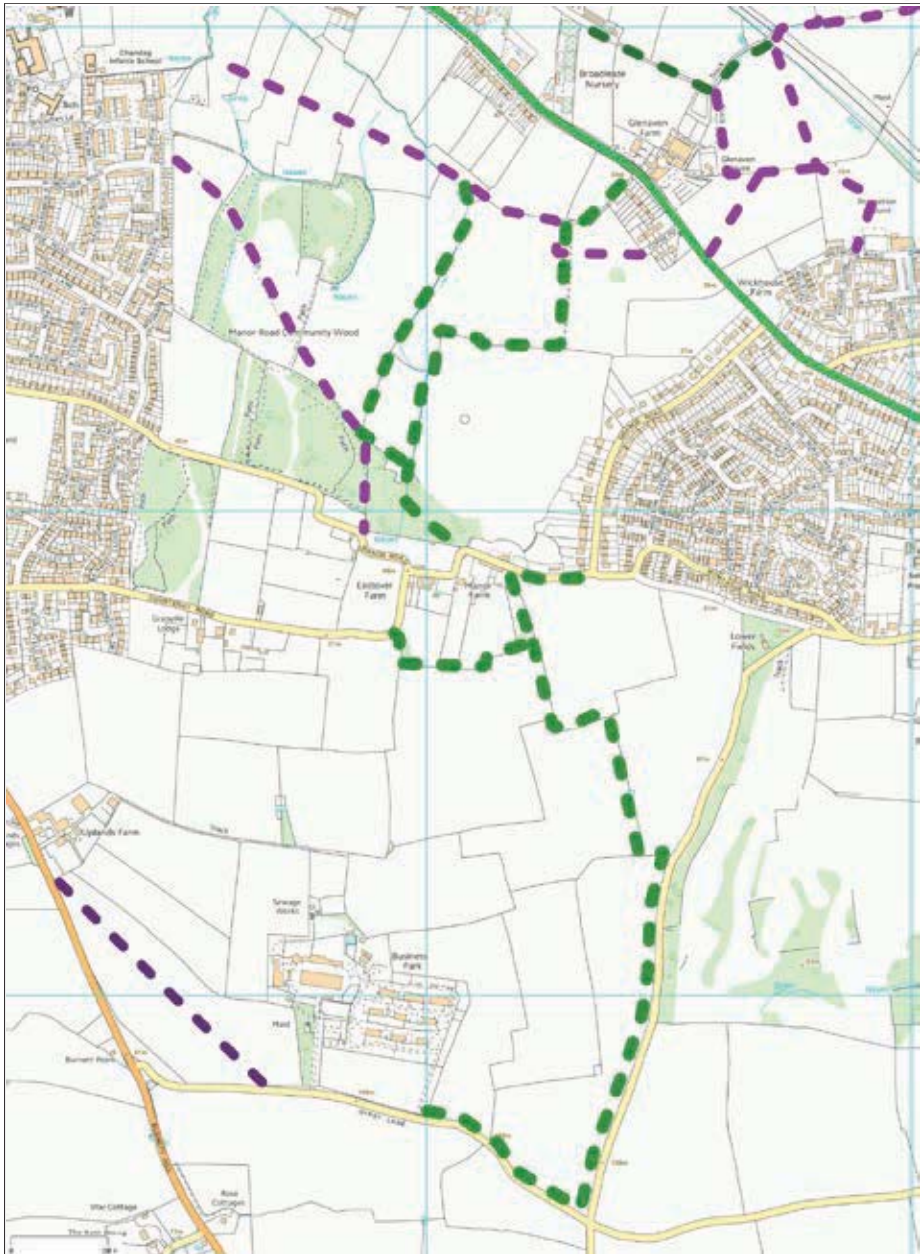
Michael's wife Malvina passed away in 1980 and several years later Michael found love again with Patricia, whilst they were both visiting Switzerland. In his words, they clicked straight away and then lived together in Israel for 3 years before Michael retired and they would then move to Salford.

When moving to Israel, Grandma remembers taking the board game scrabble with her and on the first few games Michael said 'that it was too much for him and couldn't cope with it' – years later, this is the same feeling I equally have when I first tried playing Michael! But he continued to play and soon after arriving in Salford, he joined a local scrabble club and quickly became one of their best players – not bad for someone who didn't have any schooling after the age of 11 and English wasn't his first language.

Soon after moving to the UK, Grandma and Michael were watching a TV programme which celebrated the efforts of Nicholas Winton who had helped arrange the kinder transport to the UK, and here Michael saw a face from the past, a childhood friend who had made it safely to the UK. After contacting the TV company, the Sunday Mirror arranged for Michael and his friend, Hana, to be reunited. During this interview Michael is quoted as saying that he now wanted to finally stop the past from haunting him and refused to let it dominate his whole life.

Through Michael's experiences he placed great importance on education. He spent time in local schools talking about his experiences and he has also documented key events with the National Archive. Michael's message was often a simple one, to grasp education and opportunities with both hands, not just because you don't know what the future holds, but because it will also help to avoid awful events like those he and millions of others had to endure.

A Warning from Avon & Somerset Police

Forcewide there has been several groups of rogue traders preying on elderly people by claiming to be able to carry out maintenance work for them that either does not need doing, or is shoddily completed and then charge the occupant extortionate amounts of money for the sub-standard work.



There are many tell-tale warning signs to look out for if someone approaches you and offers to complete maintenance work if they simply knock on your door.

Firstly, does the person have identification as to who they are, what company they work for and logos and phone numbers displayed on their van?

Secondly, are they able to give you invoice paper work for the work they have completed?

Thirdly, are they wearing a yellow tabard which has no logos on in an attempt to make them look legitimate?

Fourthly, are they offering to complete work for you that up until now, you have not needed?

If alarm bells begin to ring then please call 999 because such calls are an offence, usually fraud.

Parking issues in and around Saltford

Highways and on-street parking are the responsibility of B&NES Council. Parking in and around Saltford generates much discussion and debate among residents. Saltford Parish Council has decided to conduct a “conversation” with residents of Saltford, local businesses, and commuters to Saltford to seek information, views, and suggested solutions to parking issues in and around Saltford. The objective is for the Parish Council to be in a position to put forward a set of constructive proposals in Spring 2016 to B&NES Council and other bodies for possible action. We recognise that people do need to park, that no householder can claim the right to sole access to the parking space outside their home, and that problems should not be simply moved from one street or part of a street to another. The Parish Council has no predetermined view on parking issues other than a desire to improve road safety and find workable solutions to parking issues.



Descriptions of problems are helpful but we would particularly welcome practical suggestions for potential solutions to the issues experienced in Saltford under the following headings:-

- Possible parking regulations or measures in the interest of **public safety**
- The provision and possible control of **short stay parking**
- The provision and possible control of **long stay parking**
- Opportunities to **increase parking provision** in Saltford and to make **better use** of existing parking space
- Changing **parking behaviour**
- Encouraging **less car use** in Saltford
- Other **ideas**
