An Update on The Hall

Its been an extremely busy time since the last SCAN, both in terms of the huge success of the Festival and continued investment in the Hall.

As you will see in a wonderful double colour page spread in the middle of this SCAN, the Festival was a huge success. With over 80 events there was hopefully something for everyone to enjoy. A big thank you to the people of Saltford and the surrounding area for coming out in large numbers to support and enjoy every single event and of course a huge thank you to everyone who gave their time to make all these events happen. If this has inspired you to get more involved in helping with fundraising events, then don't be shy and get in touch at events@saltfordhall.co.uk or ring the Office on 01225 874081. In total the Festival raised over £14,500 for the SCA and a number of other local charities.

In time for the Festival we had 2 significant improvements we wanted to complete. In conjunction with the installation of the hearing loop in the Main Hall and Avon Room, we have purchased a substantial new Sound Desk and installed a new PA system and speakers to go with this. This new system was enjoyed at many of the events throughout the Festival and means the Hall now has a state of the art sound systems that can be used by all professional hirers without needing to bring in their own systems.

Also in time for the Festival we undertook a comprehensive upgrade and safety certification of the stage lighting system, to also include LEDs for the first time. Again these improvements mean we can now offer a more state of the art lighting system to complement the new sound system and the unique offering we have at the Hall. We are now actively marketing the Main Hall, stage, green room and fly tower as a unique facility for outside production companies to hire to increase our income.

In terms of maintenance items we have just completed the replacement of all our leaking guttering at the rear of the building, plus a full replacement of facias and guttering around the entire Wansdyke Room, together with significant work to repair the rotten gable ends of this building. Last summer we redecorated the 2 upstairs rooms, this August we plan to have working parties redecorating the Avon Room and parts of the Wansdyke Room.

Archers hit gold in the heat of the sun

The best of young UK talent shot in soaring temperatures over the weekend 6th/7th July and turned in some sizzling performances. Hopes were high and the hundreds of young archers taking part did not disappoint. The National Outdoor Championships were held at the Archery GB Headquarters, Lilleshall National Sports Centre in Shropshire.

Harvey, a 10 year old from Bitton Archers who joined the club just a year ago entered as his first official competition shooting barebow. He had a slow start with nerves getting the better of him. They shot 6 dozen arrows at 40 yards before lunch, then in the afternoon a further 4 dozen at 30 yards and another 2 dozen arrows at 20 yards. Harvey's total score was 801 which gave him second place and the silver medal in his category beating contestants from across the UK. The event had "Rose award" status and those who reached the required high scores were able to claim the rose award, this Harvey has done.

When asked how he enjoyed it, young Harvey replied "I found it very nerve wracking, which did put me off my aim a little but it was a great day and everyone was very friendly and welcoming. I hope to go back next year and try for gold"



My favourite comment, from a resident, after this year's Salford Festival was, "You said it took a year to plan but it was all over in 9 days, was it worthwhile? My slightly defensive reply was, "Yes".

Nearly a year ago a small, very hard working committee started to organise the second festival. The aims were:

- to respond to repeated requests from residents that there should be a festival/fete in the village (possibly now on a regular basis)
- to tap into the expertise of Salford based individuals and groups for contributions to the festival
- to discover material for future community entertainment
- to provide a worthwhile and enjoyable series of events that was broad and balanced and took account of all age groups

We advertised in SCAN for ideas and for volunteers and gradually over the months individuals and groups came forward.

The photographs depict a massive input from hundreds of residents as well as people from other localities. They show, dedication and hard work, humour, a sense of history and geography, friendship, creativity, ingenuity, risk taking, sporting activity, music, dance and above all enjoyment. The photographs alone are a due response to requests for a festival in the village.



It goes without saying that we mention our evening entertainers with pride: the Salford Village Choir gave a memorable concert, the Golf Club provided a delicious BBQ as well as great entertainment during the day.

Lucy's amazing Dance

Factory performed Alice's travels, Decade Dolls gave us an Abba Night, Nick Pallett amazed us with his young 'Talent' and Day Tripper performed brilliantly with their 60s contribution. The Quiz was highly contested



and a 'sell out'! Maybe the bringing together of 5 of our local hostelrys to provide a 'Taste of Salford' was the biggest feat for the organisers and the chefs - it was awesome!

No festival is all glitz and glamour. For the first time Salford had it's 'Fringe'. Each event was of a very high



standard and ranged from walks, talks, memories, dancing, a disco for infants, a pizza night for older children, and a graffiti work shop, taster sessions for many crafts, hobbies and sports and

the Scouts and Guides and Brownies gave sterling service. Other events were very well received. All these events



were innovative. Who would have guessed the response to the scarecrow competition or the height of the Stove Pipe Hats! To add to our scarlet Village Crier we now have a splendid 'Brunel' and if you were observant you would have spotted 'My Lady Hungerford' with her dignified costume- a member of The Farandole Dancers, walking in the Old



Village Street. Publications include, a book of stories from The Short Story Competition, a revised version of The History of Salford and the forthcoming Book of Salford Memories



For 9 days Salford demonstrated the British spirit! The festival was a success. Although making money

was not one of the committee's aims we were very pleased to have added a substantial amount to our Salford Hall and Community Association upgrading fund and to make donations to 5 charities. In 2015 there may well be another festival. We hope there will be new enthusiasm, new ideas and new faces!

SALTFORD SCOUTS CARRY OUT ENVIRONMENTAL SURVEY

As part of National Scout Community Week 1st Saltford Scout Group and Argus Explorer Scout Unit joined together with the Saltford Environment Group to map and survey the local footpaths around the village. The information that they gathered will be used by the Environment Group to plan future conservation work, and in the near future will be put on a website so that all people in the village will be aware of the diversity on offer just yards from their homes.



During the week each section of the Scout Group was given one footpath to investigate.
